## When One Plus One Equals Three: The Illusion of Co-Occurring Disorders

### Course Description:

This course will present core concepts as to why African American adolescents appear to be more prevalent in gangs, and this training will focus not only in identifying these reasons but will also focus on insights from a communal perspective. In addition, the course will offer interventions geared toward African American youth who may be at a higher risk for gang involvement.

**Target Audience:** Community-Based Organizations and ACBH contracted Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder Provider staff.

### Measurable Learning Objectives:

- Define two term co-occurring disorders and distinguish them from substance-induced psychiatric disorders.
- Identify two statistics on the prevalence of co-occurring disorders; and five characteristics that make diagnosis and treatment of these disorders essential.
- Define and describe three distinctive benefits of Medications for Addiction Treatment (MAT).
- List two key clinical aspects of medication management for co-occurring treatments.
- Describe two advantages and disadvantages of single-modality treatments versus multi-modality treatments and distinguish between sequential, parallel, and co-occurring treatments.
