Incorporating Afrocentric Models and Community-Based Approaches: From Theory to Praxis Across the African Diaspora

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This workshop equips clinicians with integrative, culturally grounded healing models informed by Black feminist praxis and Afro-diasporic traditions. Drawing on personal narratives and collaborations with Afro-Colombian and Afro-Brazilian women, the session explores emotional reparations, communal care, art, and spirituality as healing modalities. Participants will examine implicit bias in clinical care and learn to expand their therapeutic toolkits with practices that affirm Black communal resilience, creativity, and spirituality.
